Music Literacy - One of the key components of developing outstanding musicians is music literacy. While Choir students certainly need to listen well to hear pitches and rhythms, the use of their sense of sight is also crucial! Recently, 6th grade students have taken a music literacy pre-test and we've been practicing identifying the following musical terms and concepts: pitch letters and solfege syllables on the treble clef and the bass clef, rhythmic values of notes and rests including dots and ties, tempos, dynamics, articulations, piano notes, key signatures, intervals, and more music theory basics! 6th grade students will be completing a post-test this week on Thursday or Friday. We will continue to apply our knowledge to new music as we prepare for our upcoming concerts! If you'd like to see exactly what your students are learning about music literacy, check out some of the pages on the Choir website with them and have them demonstrate how quickly they can successfully complete some of the speed challenges. You could also take the music literacy pre-test (requires a TCAPS student login) with them so they can demonstrate their knowledge!
